No women or children listed on this list - 151-C. I would say until it could be disproven, that here is OUR man!! I have read through many lists and tho' the name is spelled Widman, it'd be pronounced Weedman, and spelling in those days wasn't so accurate, nor did they put much emphasis on it.

Hello Cousins,

Well I guess we have a harvest of news this time for a newsletter so we will go to press....

Although Nick Weedman and family are living in Japan these days, Nick seems to be getting a trip to the main office in the States pretty often. The family visited relatives this summer, also. They seem to enjoy Japan, and are all learning the language.

Summer news seems to be mostly from the DANIEL WEEDMAN line; beginning with a Family Reunion of the WEEDMAN-LITTLE-JORDAN families. Homer Weedman, grandson of DANIEL, and son of Jacob Weedman married Sarah Jane Little, called "Jenny" for short. Their children are listed on pages 13 & 14 Dec. 1971 Newsletter, and corrections to that in the June 1972 Newsletter, page 5 &6. After Homer's death, she mazried Lee Jordan and had 5 children by that marriage, totalling 12 in all for Sarah Jane "Jenny" (Little) Weedman Jordan. The reunion in Portland on July 31 was the first gathering for all the descendents of this clan. Paul and I went, although we were from Jacob's brother George's line.....George would be Homer's Uncle..... and other cousins from the JACOB WEEDMAN line were there .....Christian Jr's brother Jacob. There were over 100 there including children. Seventy-seven signed in on the register. It was a beautiful day, and everyone was enjoying the good fellowship, food and games.
