Christian Weedman, Sr. In Virginia in 1762!

Recent research has revealed that Christian Weedman, Senior and his wife, Elizabeth, were living in Hampshire County, Virginia (now West Virginia) in 1762. In addition, details of the family of Adam and Mary (Weedman) Myers, the oldest daughter of Christian and Elizabeth Weedman were learned.

Prior research had shown the earliest known location of Christian Weedman, Sr. was in Favette County, Pennsylvania. In a letter written by Dr. J. A. Walters of Dayton, Ohio on March 17, 1879 and published in a Fayette County newspaper in the 1880s, he stated that Weedman had taken residence there in 1769. Land had been acquired by "Tomahawk Improvement" and later legal title was obtained. We know that Christian got a warrant to land in Fayette County on April 1, 1785, had a survey done on April 25, 1785, and received a patent on the land on June 11, 1798. This was the land he called, "New Holland". However, no record of movements prior to 1769 were known for Christian. Before this discovery, that is!

An application for a Revolutionary War pension by **Adam Myers** contained some excellent information on the family. The information is abstracted and quoted:

Adam Myers Revolutionary War Widow's Application

Myers, Adam (or Moyer)

Pennsylvania line, application W10552.

Soldier was son of Henry Moyer (Myers), Senior and was born 5, 15, or 25 March 1775 (sic) at Fort Town on the Potomac River in Virginia. Soldier married Mary, daughter of Christian and Elizabeth Wiedman (sic) on 2 August 1779. She was born 1 February 1762 at South Branch, Virginia. Soldier died 15 December 1844. Widow applied 24 March 1845 in Huron County, Ohio. Children were:

Of interest is the fact that the wife of Christian Weedman, Jr., Mary Marshall, apparently lived in an adjacent Rockingham County, Virginia where her father, James Marshall left his will in the late 1780s.

Kentucky Death Records , concluded from the Summer 1996 Issue....

This is the conclusion of a listing of death records obtained off the Internet from Kentucky State Vital Statistics. There is an obvious gap from Louis C. Weedman to William R. Weedman in the list — the inability of the operator (Nick Weedman) to extract all of the file.

The list is published here for two reasons: first, to fill in information on some of the individuals that was lacking previously, and second, to demonstrate information which is available on the Internet. The ability to access information from census records, vital statistics, etc. on-line is changing the whole face of genealogy.

The Internet is carrying more information which is of interest to genealogists. The conclusion of the listing of Weedmans in the Kentucky Death Statistics is just one example of what is becoming available.
